

Healthy Moms, Healthy Babies Program *a care management program for high-risk pregnancies*

CommunityConnect HealthPlanSM is committed to working in collaboration with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services and key providers in the community to offer a comprehensive medical home program. Our program, Healthy Moms, Healthy Babies, is for pregnant women at risk of a poor birth outcome. Our medical home pilot sites for this program are:

Healthy Moms, Healthy Babies Program Goals

Healthy Moms, Healthy Babies is CommunityConnect's program specific to pregnant members who may have or who are experiencing a high-risk pregnancy. The goals of Healthy Moms, Healthy Babies are to:

1. Provide high-risk pregnant women with enhanced access to comprehensive care that addresses an individual's entire health and social support needs;
2. Address the psycho-social and social support needs of high-risk pregnant women through effective care management and links to community-based resources and services;
3. Promote the use of and adherence to, evidence-based clinical guidelines;
4. Ensure continuity and coordination of care among multiple providers who are involved in an individual's care;
5. Provide resources and tools to medical home providers in order to support the provider-patient relationship;
6. Enhance the involvement of consumers in their care, promote self-care management and health promotion and prevention; and
7. Optimize care, improve outcomes and reduce unnecessary health care costs.

Qualifications for Enrollment in the Healthy Moms, Healthy Babies Program

Pregnant members qualify for high-risk care management by meeting certain risk criteria and conditions.

Member Eligibility Criteria

Ideal candidates for high-risk care management must meet one criterion from each of the categories below:

Category A: Currently pregnant, preferably within the first 20 weeks of pregnancy

Category B: Under the age of 18, **or**, on or eligible to be on the state of Wisconsin's Department of Health Services High Risk Registry (must meet at least one high-risk conditions outlined below)

Category C: Live in one of the following ZIP codes in southeastern Wisconsin, **or**, experienced at least one of the high-risk conditions (outlined below):

High Risk Conditions

Members also may have experienced at least one of the following pregnancy conditions in their outcome history:

- Low birth weight < 2,500 grams (5 lbs., 8 oz.)
- Large for gestational age > 4,500 grams
- Premature birth < 37weeks
- Stillbirth
- Neonatal Intensive Care Unit admission > Five days

The mother may have one or more of these conditions in her health history:

- Diabetes
- Hypertension
- Pre-eclampsia/Eclampsia/Hypertension in pregnancy
- Infections: Sexually transmitted infections (STIs), urinary tract infections (UTIs) or Strep B
- Mental health disorder/Substance abuse (excludes smoking)
- Smoker

Or, the member may have one or more of the following chronic conditions:

- Asthma
- Cardiac disease
- Diabetes
- Hypertension
- Pulmonary disease
- Behavioral/mental health issues
